

Women Lawyers Joining Hands (WLJH) has partnered with legal experts from the Nepal Bar Association (NBA), RoHLR UNDP, international law firm, DLA Piper, and other international lawyers, to deliver a six-day skills enhancement training for 60 women lawyers from various parts of Nepal, with different professional experiences, specializations and talents.

In December 2017, trainers from Nepal, Canada, France, Hong Kong and the United States will meet again to work with two groups – 30 participants of the 2017, March 2017 training and additional new batch of 30 women lawyers.

This training is part of WLJH long-term initiative to support women lawyers in developing their legal practices in Nepal. WLJH works to ensure that women receive the same opportunities currently enjoyed by their male colleagues in the legal profession, such as placements with established law firms, and access to international legal knowledge, professional networks, training and mentoring.

The financial support for this training is provided by the *Strengthening the Rule of Law and Human Rights Protection System in Nepal Programme (RoLHR) (UNDP)*. *DLA Piper and the other international lawyers provide their time in-kind and pay all expenses to participate in this training.*
